- F. Practice – There will be no separate practice facilities but competitors will be allowed to practice on tables not currently in use at the discretion of the Referee.
- G. The Middlesex Table Tennis Association will provide the trophies for the events.
- H. Players participating in these Championships are eligible to represent the county of Middlesex in the County Championships and their contact details will be recorded on the Middlesex County register. By entering these championships, it is deemed that they have consented to their details being recorded.

### TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS

1. Every entrant must be affiliated as a Player Member to Table Tennis England and have a valid player licence.
2. Eligibility: a) Any player who was born in Middlesex whose boundaries are as defined by the ETTA; b) Any player who resides in Middlesex boundaries as defined by the ETTA; c) Any player who is non-resident but represents Middlesex in the County Championships. Players who play for another county and are either resident, or born in Middlesex are not eligible.

3. ETTA Tournament Regulations apply to this Tournament including Regulation R (Regulations banning use of certain adhesives and restricting "gluing-up"). Completion and submission of this Entry Form signifies agreement by the entrant to the conditions of this competition.
4. All competitors may be required to umpire at least one match in the knock-out stage (loser stays to umpire) in each event entered and also in the groups. There may be Consolation Events at the discretion of the Organiser.
5. All matches shall be the best of five games. Play throughout shall be on a knockout basis, with the exception of the preliminary rounds, which shall be, in principle, groups of four, with the first and second placed in each group going forward to the knock-out championship and the third and fourth placed going forward to the consolation knock-out competition. The final order in a group shall be determined as per ITTF regulation 3.7.5 for group competitions.
6. All competitors must report to the control table on arrival and be ready to play at the scheduled time for all matches. Failure to adhere could lead to being scratched from the event.
7. The Referee's decision shall be final on points of law or any question arising not provided for in these Regulations, or in any dispute as to the interpretation thereof. Decisions on points of fact by an umpire or assistant umpire appointed by the Referee shall be final. Assistant umpires will not be appointed except at the discretion of the Referee.
8. Competitors will not be allowed to glue up at the playing venue under any circumstances. Playing venue means the whole establishment in the playing building and the ground where the playing building stands, which contains the doorway, the car park and related facilities. Any player found gluing up may be disqualified.
9. All players shall sign the following undertaking:  
I undertake:  
a. to observe the regulations of the tournament;  
b. to abide by the decisions of the Referee;  
c. to fulfil the schedule of play arranged for me unless prevented by circumstances beyond my control, and accepted as such by the Referee.
