County Championships — Senior

Our county has won the Senior Championships on several occasions. Another familiar name on the trophy is that of Derbyshire.

Once again it is these 2 counties who are battling it out for top honours after the first weekend of Senior County Championships Premier Division which took place at Cippenham Table Tennis Club in Slough.

There were three newly promoted sides; Avon, Cornwall and Nottinghamshire, who were hoping to retain their Premier Division status alongwith the other established counties and this season could prove to be an interesting one!

Middlesex and Derbyshire both have five points out of six. The two sides didn't meet. It seems that the competition is going to be very evenly matched this year. Middlesex dominated their first round match beating Cornwall 8-2. The team was a very young one – Daniel Basterfield, Ryan Maynard, Tin-Tin Ho and Sarah Horsnell, who were all undefeated in their singles games in this match.

Tin-Tin Ho was the only player to win all six games over the weekend, and held her side together in their 5-5 draw against Avon. She beat Michele Reeves 3-1 and got the better of Melissa Wright 11-9, 11-7, 11-6.

Lloyd Gregory scored a superb 3-1 win over Daniel Basterfield but was found wanting in his second singles, when he lost 3-0 to Ryan Maynard.

In the next match Middlesex had an impressive 8-2 win over Nottinghamshire. Tin-Tin Ho played a tight match against Sophie Neil and despite serving into the net at 8-7 in the final game she kept her nerve to win 11-3, 5-11, 11-7, 6-11, 11-9. Jason Ramage suffered his only defeat when succumbing 3-0 to Daniel Basterfield whilst Ping Ho and Ryan Maynard both beat Mark Green.


Ping Ho and Sushmita Limbu who each chipped in with one win to confirm their narrow victory.

The England team for this, the 10th World Schools' Championships, has a large contingent from London. London schools' represent England in both the Boys' and Girls' School Team events. The Boys' School Team event will see The Harefield Academy, Ux-

bridge represented by Mitchell Jones, Danny Lewis, Baiden Thoroughgood and Tyrone Wells led by Eli Baraty.

In the National Selected Team event, players from different schools join together to form a team. Representing the boys will be Adam Harrison (The King's School, Grantham), Liam McTiernan (Waingels College, Reading), Igor Morais (West London Academy) and Helshan Weerasinghe (The Judd School, Tonbridge). Paul

Birch will be the teams non-playing captain.

The girls' team includes Emily Bates (Kesteven & Grantham Girls' School), Tin Tin Ho (City of London School for Girls) Vicky Smith (Devonport High School for Girls) and Emma Torkington (King's School, Canterbury). Gail Johns will be their non-playing team captain.

Tin-Tin Champion in Portugal!!!

Tin-Tin Ho became only the third English player to return triumphant from the Portuguese Youth Open after winning the Cadet Girls' singles competition in Tavira.

She joins Joanna Parker (2003 Junior Girls' Champion) and Paul Drinkhall (2004 Cadet Boys' Champion) on a prestigious list of victors including previous winners such as Tiago Apolonia, Bernadette Szocs and Dmitrij Ovcharov.

It was the 19th edition of the Portuguese Youth Open and England had sent 10 players to compete in both the singles and team competitions.

With the teams' results

proving fruitless (all four sides finished between eighth and 12th) it was down to the singles competitions to see if any of the young English starlets could produce a big performance.

It proved to be the case with Tin-Tin Ho winning all six of her matches to take the title over favourite Yuan Wan from Germany in a pulsating day of entertainment.

Tin-Tin progressed through her group with relative comfort – only dropping one game, before almost stumbling in the second round to Arina-Dora Singeorzan from Romania (who she lost to in the team matches) but eventually she held on for

a narrow 3-2 win.

Her steady progress continued into the quarter-finals and semi-finals where she beat Swede Tilda Johansson 3-1 before cruising past Jennie Wolf from Germany 3-0 to reach the final.

In the final she met Wolf's team mate Wan who was the number one seed but Tin-Tin showed no break in her form and coasted the title with a confident 3-1 (11-9, 3-11, 11-9, 11-7) win.

National Junior Coach Nick Jarvis said: "Tin-Tin started off in the team event a little bit slowly but as the tournament went on she started taking the ball at the top of the bounce

and attacking more.

He added: "She played the best table tennis in the important points. At key times in the matches she came out with her best table tennis and when she had to win the point to keep the pressure off she was a star."
